

Claudio Acioly is awarded with the Honor of Merit Title

On the 5th of April 2024, the University Council of the University of Brasilia, Brazil, awarded Claudio Acioly Jr with the title of Merit of Honour in public recognition for his work and services provide to society nationally and internationally, aligned with the institutional, political and pedagogical project of the university. The Merit of Honour, also referred to as Order of Merit or Title of Honour or Honorary Title, is a title conferred to individuals as an award in recognition to their distinguished merits, duties and services provided to society and its developments holding a highest standard of ethics and impact. In some countries it is the highest tribute paid to individuals for services to the nation.

On 18 of April, a Motion of Request was submitted to the Chamber of Representatives of the Congress of Brazil to register the award received by Acioly, in which it highlighted a series of his achievements, publications and professional work that has contributed to the advancement of housing and urban development in Brazil and abroad.

On 26 of April, the award ceremony was held in the campus of the University of Brasilia, commemorating its 62nd anniversary, when 4 distinguished alumni were from different disciplines: the anthropologist Carlos Rodrigues Brandão (post mortem), the architect and urban planner Cláudio Acioly Junior, the nutritionist Lucilene Maria de Sousa, the economist Marwil Jhonatan Davila Fernandes e the medical doctor Paulo Marcelo Gehm Hoff. Acioly was represented by his mother, Teresinha Acioly, who received the diploma from the hands of the University Rector, Prof Márcia Abrahão Moura.
